Congregation Mishkan Or is honored to welcome Maya Wiley, lawyer, professor, and civil rights activist, as our guest speaker for the Erev Shabbat Worship Honoring the Legacy of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. on Friday, January 17, 6 pm. The service will be in person and live-streamed and co-led by our Mishkan Or

Clergy Team.

President and CEO of The Leadership Conference on Civil and Human Rights, Maya Wiley is a nationally respected civil rights attorney and activist who has dedicated her life to the fights for justice, equality, and fairness. Serving as the first Black woman counsel to the mayor of New York City, she helped deliver on civil and immigrant rights. During her tenure, the city also saw an expansion of minority women-owned business enterprises contracts. Following her time at City Hall, Wiley moved to academia as a faculty member and Senior Vice President for Social Justice at the New School, a university in New York City.

Maya Wiley has written, "We celebrate the gains we have made for Black people and people of all races, ethnicities, religions, and genders. The gains are real, but we haven't yet reached the mountain top Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. reminded us that we are climbing to reach. I had to fight alongside staunch allies in Congress to combat that fake news of an anti-civil rights platform that supports book bans, banning history of racism, and pushing transphobia to drive a larger agenda to roll back our rights."

At this Shabbat Service honoring Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., we will also welcome members of our partner organizations, the Interfaith Group Against Hate and Greater Cleveland Congregations. We will also be joined by the Praise Choir from Affinity Missionary Baptist Church.

Please join us on Friday, January 17, as we honor the legacy of Dr. Martin Luther King, and Saturday, January 18, 9 am, when we explore some of Dr. King's writings, see page 3.



Caring for Our Environment

Congregation Mishkan Or shares a concern that so many of us have - concern for our environment. With that in mind, we're proud to share the launch of a new initiative to more fully live our Jewish values of being *Shomrei Adamah*, Guardians of the Earth. Specifically, we will begin composting our organization's food scraps in partnership with Rust Belt Riders, whose mission is to "feed people, not landfills." Since 2014, this organization has been working with people and organizations in Northeast Ohio to provide an alternative to landfills for their food scraps.

Starting at our Erev Shabbat Service on January 17, when we honor the legacy of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr., we be making some incremental changes to help us manage food waste at Mishkan Or:

Additional Receptacles and Signage

Trash and compost receptacles will be clearly marked and placed near the Oneg tables. Our Oneg pastry trays will no longer include items individually wrapped in paper to eliminate further landfill waste.

Compostable Paper Products

All disposable paper products, cups, and utensils are fully compostable at our onegs, as long as they are placed in **our labeled compost bin** - sadly, compostable products disposed in trash bins are heading to a landfill.

Household Service

The partnership we are beginning will start to address the waste we create as an organization. While we are not able to accept individual congregant's compost, you can arrange to have compost pick up at your home in some communities, or by using community drop off locations via Rust Belt Riders, www.rustbeltriders.com.

Recyling Batteries

Congregation Mishkan Or offers a drop-off for used batteries that will be recycled. You can drop off used household batteries at our front desk during office hours.

Celebration Chanukah


